Did You Know...

According to the Florida Wildlife Commission:

- All persons operating or riding on or behind a personal watercraft must have an approved personal flotation device.
- A person must be at least 14 years old to operate and at least 18 years old to rent a personal watercraft.
- It is a second degree misdemeanor to knowingly allow a person under 14 to operate a personal watercraft.
- Persons under 21 must complete an approved boating education course with ID before operating with a 10 hp or larger motor.
- Watercraft must have registration, a fire extinguisher, engine kill switch, and whistle at all times.
